- This is likely to be the future for next couple of years;
- It is also referred to as Catalog 2.0 or OPAC 2.0;
- Combination of ILS, discovery tools and mashups;

# NextGen catalog - what is expected?

- Browsing;
- Mashups;
- Features user-generated metadata and content;
- Offers users experiences;
- Makes metadata reusable – for both human and machine;

# NextGen catalog – what it is?

- This is not a catalog per se – it is a tool designed to make it easier for students to learn, teacher to instruct, and scholars to do research. It provides the audience an effective means for finding and using information;

# Web 2.0

- This part of the Internet era is known as Web 2.0 age. Web 2.0 is characterized by web-enabled applications that are built around user-generated or user manipulated content; Web 2.0 phenomenon is the read/write web, where users are both consumers and producers of online content. Blogs, wikis, RSS feeds, user-added reviews, ratings, and summaries, instant messaging, podcasts and vodcasts, folksonomies, tagging, and tag clouds, social bookmarking, social networking sites, streaming audio and video, community photo services or photo sharing, community book services (publishing etc) are marks of this era.

# Library 2.0

- Library 2.0 is loosely defined as a library modelled on Web2.0 technologies—emphasis is placed on user-centered change and participation in the creation of content and community-based services.

# Library 2.0 and users

- Information addicted;
- Self sufficient;
- Preference for electronic to print format;
- accustomed to content without containers;
- Values context-added intellectual content;
- Completely wired;
- Demands 24 x 7 access;
- Multi-tasking and boundary between home, study and work obliterated

# Library 2.0 and collection

- Traditional and non-traditional content;
- Direct links to online content—text and media formats;
- Evaluative content such as summaries, abstracts, tables of contents, and excerpts;
- Relevant search results;
- Item and availability information— if the item is available and how to get it;
- Simple keyword search with an advanced, guided search option;

# Library 2.0 and services

- Adopting social network sites such as, facebook, Twitter, Youtube for announcing services;
- Integrating IM, SMS, RSS for providing services in a personalized way;



# Discovery systems

- New interfaces, popularly referred to as “discovery tools” are built around Web 2.0/Library 2.0 concepts.
- AquaBrowser, Encore, Primo, and WorldCat Local are such products with a strong competitor from open source endeavour – Vufind, a low-cost alternative to the commercial offerings in this genre. It delivers new-generation library interface features such as relevancy ranking, facets for narrowing results, presentation of book images, and links to ILS systems for real-time availability;
